1. Introduction

MomieGo is committed to providing a safe, trusted environment for parents and families. We have zero tolerance for Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation (CSAE) and any content or conduct that endangers minors.

We actively work to prevent, detect, remove, and report CSAE-related activity on our platform in accordance with applicable laws and Google Play policies.

2. Zero-Tolerance Policy on Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM)

MomieGo strictly prohibits:

- Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM) in any form
- Content that depicts, promotes, or facilitates sexual exploitation of minors
- Grooming behavior or inappropriate communication with minors
- Solicitation of minors for sexual purposes
- The use of the platform to facilitate trafficking or exploitation of children
- Any attempt to upload, store, share, or distribute CSAM

Any confirmed violation will result in immediate and permanent account termination and may be reported to the appropriate authorities.

3. Proactive Detection, Moderation, and Reporting

To prevent CSAE and protect users, MomieGo implements the following safeguards:

Automated Monitoring & Content Review

We utilize automated detection tools and manual moderation processes to identify and remove content that violates our child safety standards.

User Reporting Mechanisms

Users can report:

- Profiles
- Messages
- Photos
- Comments
- Suspicious behavior

Reports are reviewed promptly by our Trust & Safety team.

Immediate Action on Confirmed Violations

Upon obtaining actual knowledge of CSAM or exploitation:

- The content is removed immediately
- The account is suspended or permanently banned
- Confirmed CSAM is reported to the **National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC)** and/or relevant regional authorities as required by law

Cooperation with Law Enforcement

MomieGo cooperates with law enforcement agencies and child protection organizations in investigations involving child exploitation or abuse.

4. Compliance with Child Safety Laws

MomieGo complies with all applicable child protection and reporting laws, including but not limited to:

- U.S. federal and state child exploitation laws
- Mandatory reporting requirements involving CSAM
- The Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA)
- The UK Online Safety Act
- The EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) relating to children
- Any other applicable regional child protection laws

5. Age Restrictions & Platform Eligibility

MomieGo is designed exclusively for adults.

- Users must be **18 years of age or older** to create an account.
- We do not knowingly allow minors to use the platform.
- Accounts found to belong to individuals under 18 will be immediately removed.

We reserve the right to request age verification when necessary to ensure compliance.

6. Community Standards & Enforcement

To maintain a safe environment:

- Content involving minors must comply with all safety guidelines.
- Any sexualized content involving minors is strictly prohibited.
- Users engaging in CSAE-related conduct will be permanently banned.
- Severe violations will be escalated to authorities and reporting organizations.

MomieGo maintains internal review procedures to ensure consistent enforcement of these standards.
